2. Organizational Profile

- A. **Our Vision:** To realize good governance and a strong civil society based on democratic values and social justice.
- B. **Our Mission:**
 - 1. To promote responsive, transparent, and accountable governance through research, advocacy, and policy dialogue.
 - 2. To mobilize active public participation by strengthening local community capacity and the spirit of local wisdom.

3. Strategic Activities & Impact Metrics 2025

In 2025, LSKP focused on high-impact programs that directly influence public welfare and democratic integrity:

A. Technical Assistance for Minimum Service Standards (SPM) – Wajo Health Office

This initiative focused on ensuring that the regional government meets the essential health needs of its citizens through standardized protocols.

1. **The Goal:** To improve the quality of health service delivery in Wajo Regency by aligning local practices with national Minimum Service Standards.
2. **Impact Metrics:**
 - a. **Human Capital:** Engaged and empowered **100 Doctors and Health Workers** through intensive training and capacity-building sessions.
 - b. **Service Standardization:** Established a unified reporting and service framework for primary health care facilities.
 - c. **Direct Impact:** Enhanced the professional competency of frontline medical staff, leading to more accurate health data and improved primary care accessibility for the community in Wajo.

B. Monitoring of RT/RW Elections in Makassar

Monitoring the smallest unit of democracy to ensure transparency at the neighborhood level.

1. **The Goal:** To assess the transparency and readiness of community-level democratic processes.
2. **Impact Metrics:**
 - a. **Volunteer Mobilization:** Deployed **135 Monitoring Volunteers** to observe the election process directly across various sub-districts in Makassar.
 - b. **Policy Output:** Released a comprehensive monitoring report used as a key reference for local policy discussions and government recommendations.
 - c. **Direct Impact:** Identified critical gaps in logistics and administrative readiness, fostering public demand for accountability and standardized procedures in neighborhood-level leadership transitions.

C. International Representation & Global Advocacy

1. **International Conference on Cross-Cultural Religious Literacy:** LSKP shared best practices for interfaith collaboration and social inclusion.
2. **CSO Sustainability Advocacy:** Highlighted the structural and funding challenges faced by Civil Society Organizations in Eastern Indonesia.
3. **Impact:** Elevated local issues to the international stage, securing LSKP's position as a strategic partner in global discourses on peace and inclusion.

D. Youth Peace Conference: Collective Action Against Violence

LSKP played a pivotal role in the Youth Peace Conference in Makassar, emphasizing the importance of youth-led movements in addressing social conflicts and violence.

1. **The Goal:** To empower the younger generation as agents of peace and to formulate collective strategies for preventing violence in urban environments.
2. **Impact Metrics:**
 - a. **Capacity Building:** Directly engaged **50 youth leaders** and student representatives from various organizations in Makassar through intensive policy and peace-building dialogues.
 - b. **Collective Commitment:** Produced a joint declaration and a roadmap for youth-led advocacy focused on conflict resolution and social safety.
 - c. **Direct Impact:** Strengthened the network of young peacebuilders, providing them with a structured platform to voice their concerns and influence local safety policies.

E. South Sulawesi Civil Society Jamboree: Anti-Corruption & Inclusive Policy

Collaborating with various CSOs, LSKP co-organized this jamboree to synchronize civil society movements against corruption and promote inclusive governance across the province.

1. **The Goal:** To consolidate the power of civil society in monitoring government integrity and ensuring regional policies are inclusive of marginalized groups.
2. **Impact Metrics:**

- a. **Network Mobilization:** Successfully gathered and unified **100 activists and representatives from 40 Civil Society Organizations** across South Sulawesi.
- b. **Policy Advocacy:** Formulated a "Civil Society Manifesto" addressed to local governments, focusing on transparency in budget allocation and gender-inclusive public services.
- c. **Direct Impact:** Established a synchronized monitoring system among provincial CSOs to track corruption risks and advocate for the rights of vulnerable communities.
